FIRST LEGO LEAGUE ROBOTICS

The 2018/2019 school year marks the 4th year ASTAC has been sponsoring the NSBSD FIRST Lego League Robotics program. Participation has doubled this year growing to 91 students, up from 45 last school year.



Twenty six students participated in the Regional Qualifier on January 12.

The North Slope assembled an all-star team of eight students from Harold Kaveolook, Tikigaq, Nunamiut, Meade River and Eben Hopson Middle schools. The team traveled to Anchorage to compete in the State Competition where they received the Judges' Award for teamwork and perseverance in forming a team and competing in just two days. The students went from strangers to competitors and better yet, friends, and placed 17 out of 52.

"The opportunity to participate in a program like Lego Robotics helps students focus, problem solve, develop leadership qualities and find that these truths help them in their everyday lives," says Rodney Lloyd, Meade River Coach.

Three students from the Harold Kaveolook Robo Rams team placed 24th out of 52 in the Robot Run at the State Competition.

FIBER TO THE HOME

ASTAC CEO/General Manager Jens Laipenieks spoke before the Barrow City Council in November 2018 to update the council on ASTAC's Fiber to the Home build out in Utqiagvik. He gave an



overview of the project design, steps involved, challenges faced and timeline. ASTAC is overbuilding our existing outside plant with the intent to retire and remove all copper infrastructure once migrations to fiber are complete in 2019.

ASTAC invested over \$5M completing three other fiber to the home projects in Wainwright, Point Hope and Nuigsut between 2016/2017.

ASTAC's Director of Wireless Networks, Brian DeMarco presented the same information to the North Slope Borough Assembly in December 2018.



NSBSD super readers have been hitting the books and studying in preparation for the Battle of the Books District Competition held on February 8. Participation in this slope-wide reading program increased by 35 percent over last school year.



OUT WITH THE OLD



ASTAC dismantled and removed its 17-year old, 200-foot guyed tower near Tarn Road (east of Kuparuk) in January. Crews did an incredible job working in -15-degree temps to safely lower the tower and haul it off site in 40' segments. In May of 2018, a new 200' self-supporting lattice tower was erected allowing ASTAC to continue providing reliable 4G service to the area.
