About 365 students took part in the program last year, a 25% drop over the previous school year. ### ALASKA RELAY

Alaska Relay Service is a statewide service that connects standard (voice) telephone users



with deaf, hard-of-hearing, deaf-blind, speech-disabled, or late-deafened people who use text telephones (TTYs) or other telephone devices available depending on the type of relay services used. This service allows relay users to communicate with standard telephone users through specially trained Communication Assistants (CA). Calls can be made 24 hours a day, 365 days a year with no restrictions on the number, length, or type of calls. Dial 7-1-1 to place a Relay call, or for more information visit www.AlaskaRelay.com.

Want to stop unwanted telemarketing calls? You can. The Federal Do Not Call Improvement Act of 2007 gives you

control over whether telemarketers can call your personal home or cell phone. You can register for FREE at: www.donotcall.gov or by calling toll-free 1-888-382-1222.

- Register up to three personal phone numbers at a time
- Telemarketers must remove your number from call lists within 31 days
- Your number is permanently removed from telemarketing lists unless you delete your registry
